Salem Registered Voter Rolls (continued)

From the chart on p 3, it can be seen that in the period from 2020 to 2024, Salem gained 173 more registered active voters. Over the same time period the Republicans gained 133 more active voters, the Democrats lost 32 active voters, there are 73 more unaffiliated active voters, and there is one less minor party active voter. Over the same period of time the Democratic registered active voters vs. Republican registered active voters went from + 144 (**D**) to + 24 (**R**), a swing of 168 registered active voters. Additionally, the Republicans decreased the number of inactive registered voters by 5 while the Democrats increased the number of inactive registered voters by 2.

In Salem in 2020 the Biden/Harris ticket lost to the Trump/Pence ticket by 6 votes. In 2024 the Harris/Walz ticket lost to the Trump/Vance ticket by 82 votes. As a result, the trends from a Democratic perspective are going in the wrong direction.

OPINION

The Election Results Not All Bad

First, I want to thank all Salem DTC members for the work you have put into the DTC as well as the work and support you all provided for our Democratic slate of candidates. I also want to thank all those who participated in our democratic process and voted, in particular those who voted for our Democratic slate of candidates. I know the results of the presidential election, were disappointing and not what we had hoped for. However, here in CT there were some good outcomes. Both Senator Chris Murphy and our district's Congressman Joe Courtney, both Democratic front Democrat State Senator Martha Marx was re-elected defeating Republican Shaun Mastroianni for the 20th CT Senate District seat and Democrat Nick Menapace defeated Republican Holly Cheesman for the 37th district state house seat. Sadly, however, Democrat Rich Knotek was not able to unseat Republican Irene Haines for the 34th district state house seat.

I think we all need to take a breather for a few days so that with clearer minds so that we can analyze these election results, develop a strategy to turn things around, and develop a solid slate of candidates and focus on the upcoming municipal elections. *We have a lot of work to do to*.

This Election's Silver Lining


While the national news has been devastating, a silver lining is that in CT the Dems have had a gain of several House seats in the State Legislature, and continue to hold a strong majority in the State Senate. At a time when the Republicans in Congress and the administration will be leaving more responsibility to states to solve their own problems, the strong progressive presence in CT's legislature will be important. Dems have a great delegation from New London County, flipping not only Cheeseman's seat but also McCarty's seat form the 38th district, to give it an even stronger voice.

So, we will be well-represented and are in a good position to help guide state policy on issues like housing, climate change. And it is a relief to know that all ten Pro-Choice initiatives in other states had a majority of voters support them. Unfortunately, Florida's initiative did not reach the 60% majority needed to change Florida's constitution, but all the other initiatives supporting women's reproductive rights passed.

Now we will have a real test of our democratic system and its checks and balances. They have not yet folded. Most courts will not want to give up their power to the administration, and most Congressional legislators will not want to cede power to the presidency. The guardrails are still there, although clearly not what they have been.


BOOKS IN THE AFTERNOON BOOK CLUB

HOME FIRE PREPAREDNESS CAMPAIGN – AMERICAN RED CROSS

Most of us don't realize we have just two minutes to escape a home fire — which is the nation's most frequent disaster.

On average:

- 7 people die every day from a home fire, most impacting children and the elderly
- More than 30 people suffer injuries from home fires every day
- More than \$7 billion in property damage occurs from home fires every year

That's why the American Red Cross and their partners are preparing families to act quickly through their Home Fire Campaign. They have already made a lifesaving difference, achieving their initial goals of installing 2.5 million free smoke alarms and helping to make 1 million households safer in at-risk communities. But home fires remain a daily threat, so the Home Fire Campaign continues across the country.

During their home visit, at no cost to you, they will share some simple steps you can take that will help you protect you family against fire. The visits last about 20 minutes.

During your home visit the Red Cross will:

- Install FREE smoke detectors if needed,
- Provide guidance in the development of a Family Disaster Plan,
- Provide valuable emergency preparedness tips and information,

All demonstrations and installations services are performed by American Red Cross trained volunteers and/or licensed/ insured professionals.
